

Avantor earns appreciation from NSCI

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The National Safety Council in India (NSC) recently awarded the Avantor® cGMP manufacturing facility in Panoli, Gujarat, India, with a Certificate of Appreciation in the manufacturing sector covering the "Manufacture of Chemicals & Chemical Products, Manufacture of Pharmaceuticals, Medicinal Chemical and Botanical Products."

Eur.), Japanese Pharmacopoeia (JP) and British Pharmacopoeia (BP).
