

India in need of integrated health ministry

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Industry experts discuss ways of promoting innovations

It is very difficult to optimize all the stakeholders.”

Supporting this thought and bringing further suggestions, Dr Satyanarayana Chava, Founder & CEO, Laurus Labs said, “We keep hearing a lot about the convergence of technology in India. I think it is high time we converged the policies as well and brought about the required changes in our system.”

Suresh Pattathil, CEO, Ferring Pharma, India was also in sync with these observations. “Innovations in India can also be promoted by collaborating with universities globally where the best research is taking place. This will work wonders for the the pharma industry”, he added.

Bringing the attention to the growing number of startups in India, Dr Krishna Ella, CMD, Bharat Biotech said, "There are so many innovative ideas coming out of the pockets of startups in India. The startups can be the gamechangers in this space. But of course, without proper regulatory system, it will remain a challenging process. Imagine, if the government approves an innovation within 30 days, everyone will be so motivated."
