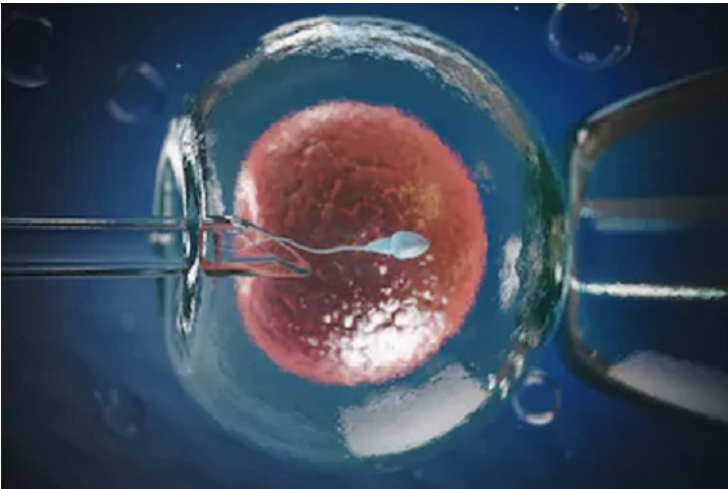


BSVL pledges Rs 10 L to support IVF treatments
