

Union Health Minister releases post-COVID-19 sequelae modules

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To help in building the capacity of health workers across India



Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare Mansukh Mandaviya has released post COVID-19 sequelae modules.

The modules will help in building the capacity of the doctors, nurses, paramedics and community health workers across India to deal with the long-term effects of COVID.
