### Bangalore gears up for Bangalore Bio 2006

The three-day event will have special focus on agri-biotech

Over 60 national and international speakers, 400 conference delegates, 125 exhibitors, 20000 business visitors from over 15 countries, various states of India, will convene at the premier annual event for the biotechnology industry at Bangalore BIO 2006. The event, now in its sixth year, will be simultaneously a conference, a business forum and a trade exhibition for the entire biotech and allied industry fraternity and will take place during June 7, 8 and 9, 2006 at the Palace grounds in Bangalore.

## Highlights of the announcement

MK Shankaralinge Gowda, secretary, Department of IT, Biotechnology and Science & Technology, Government of Karnataka

- The 100 acres biotech park in Bangalore will be operational by the end of 2006 near Electronic City. This project has been awarded to the National Building Construction Company.
- Karnataka supports investments from biofuel companies. Citing the example of the Indian Railways, biofuel farming, where-in 90,000 hectares of land have been allocated for this purpose.
- Karnataka has attracted the highest VC fund in Asia (to the tune of \$100 million).
- Karnataka will support stem cell banks and other new areas of biotechnology.

- Bangalore is evolving as an interesting ecosystem for biotechnology. Other states are also taking the initiative to follow the Bangalore model of success
- To create a biocluster, one needs a mind set of entrepreneurship and Bangalore has paved the way in this regard
- To accelerate entrepreneurship, companies such as Biozeen have set up training programs for bioprocessing.
- The institute of clinical research has been set up and will help to enhance clinical development in the country
- We need to expand infrastructure, not just roads and airports but also patent infrastructure and service infrastructure
- International patent law firms are looking at India to set up their consulting firms
- The government should take the lead for special initiatives on biofuel and bioagri technology.
- There is a global challenge for affordable drug development, infrastructure for clinical trials, clinical researchers, and centers need to be developed.

This flagship biotech event is promoted by the Government of Karnataka and organized by the Vision Group on Biotechnology. Clinical research and research processes outsourcing is becoming the core strength of India. Keeping this global trend in mind, the spotlight at this year's conference is clinical research. Other topics to be deliberated upon by over 60 international biotechnology experts are research process outsourcing, drug discovery and development, vaccines and vaccinology for the developing world, frontier technologies, bioinformatics, intellectual property rights, portfolio management, human resource development, biotechnology and global alliances.

Another interesting feature at Bangalore Bio 2006 will be Agribiotech Day, a one-day track on agribiotechnology. The sessions will address various important topics like transgenic crops, regulatory issues, environmental concerns, biofuel, food biotech, nutraceuticals and so on.

The CEO Conclave always witnesses a high power meeting point of various professionals and this year Dr RA Mashelkar, director general, CSIR and secretary, DSIR will deliver the 'Vision Talk' at the conclave.
